Renowned restaurateur chooses Knowsley for next venture

Gary Usher, the inspiration behind restaurants like Wreckfish in Liverpool and Sticky Walnut in Chester, has announced plans to open his fifth restaurant - in Prescot.

The new bistro-style restaurant will be located on Eccleston Street in the town centre and will be called Pinion. It will be the latest addition to his portfolio of Elite Bistros which also includes Burnt Truffle on the Wirral and Hispi in Didsbury.

Gary said, "This place will be small but it's an opportunity to really be part of the plan to regenerate the area."

It is great news for Knowsley to have attracted such a renowned and talented restaurateur and is testament to Prescot's growing appeal as a place 'on the up.'

Kier Construction has been appointed to build the Shakespeare North Playhouse in Prescot. The construction group has extensive experience building theatres, including the recently completed refurbishment and redevelopment of Chester Storyhouse.

Work has now commenced on site and the main construction will start in the summer. The new Playhouse will be complete in summer 2020.

The Bard opened its doors in February and has been extremely well supported by the local community and many others travelling to Prescot to sample the wide range of quality real ales, craft beers, cider and gins on offer.

FASCINATING FINDS UNEARTHED IN PRESCOT

Ahead of construction work beginning on the new Shakespeare North Playhouse in Prescot, a team of archaeologists from Salford University have carried out an investigation of the site.

They have unearthed some fascinating finds including a four metre-deep stone quarry, the footings, cellar walls and cellar floors of long-lost buildings and numerous artefacts.

Historic mapping of the area suggested sites dated to the 16th century and indicated that some of the houses had kilns on their land. Whilst the team did not discover any kilns on the Mill Street site, there was plenty of evidence of pottery production. One of the most interesting finds and the earliest form of activity was a rock-cut well which appeared to have survived in use into the 20th century having been encased in a brick-built cellar which was built later.



The archaeology team has taken away all of the artefacts to be cleaned and documented which will eventually go on display providing a fascinating glimpse into Prescot's past.





Kirkby town centre development pushes forward

Significant progress continues to be made in the development of Kirkby town centre.

St Modwen's demolition works which will make way for the new retail scheme, including a Morrisons supermarket, are well advanced and a contractor for the construction work is expected to be announced in the coming weeks. Meanwhile, the demolition of three council-owned sites in the town centre is also under way to make way for new development.

Plans to build the Shakespeare North Playhouse in Prescot was a hot topic amongst the property community at MIPIM. Newly appointed construction partner Kier gave an informal presentation on the Liverpool City Region Stand – highlighting the uniqueness of the project and its significance not just to Knowsley but the wider region and UK as a whole.



Funding secured for Huyton Village

As part of the Council's budget for 2018/19, £1.75 million has been earmarked for improvements to Huyton Village Centre. The funding will be used to enhance the public realm and general amenity to improve the experience for visitors and attract new investment and occupiers to the area.

Already a popular residential area with well-established local facilities, Huyton is home to the Council's administrative HQ and a range of national and local retailers. Its location on the M62 and direct rail links to Liverpool, Manchester, Wigan and Preston make it an attractive destination for residents and businesses.



A large programme of house building in the immediate area is driving demand for additional retail and leisure provision in the Village Centre and a number of investment and development opportunities are currently available. Specifically interest from retailers, leisure operators and residential developers is sought to explore a range of options in the immediate area.

Work underway on speculative development

Orbit Developments has started construction of a distribution scheme at Academy Business Park in Knowsley.

The speculatively-built distribution centre will have an initial first phase of 110,000 sq ft which will consist of a 100,000 sq ft warehouse and 10,000 sq ft of ground and first floor offices.

The project is next to Liverpool Football Club Training Academy, and is being built by Orbit's sister company Jones Contracts.

5750 Components invests £3m in Knowsley operation

5750 Components Ltd has taken on new staff and invested £3m to shore up its laser-cutting operations in Knowsley.

The specialist laser-cutting division of engineering and fabrication business WEC Group, used the seven-figure sum to move into larger 33,000 sq ft premises at Knowsley Business Park which will accommodate future growth. In addition 5750 has also taken on new staff members and invested in specialist machinery to help maximise productivity.

Image Business Park sold for £3.5m

A Seybourne Estates business has acquired Image Business Park for £3.5 million.

The site, located on Knowsley Business Park, was formerly one of Kodak's largest sites in the UK. It comprises more than 38 acres and provides 400,000 sq ft of office, warehouse and industrial space, with key tenants including Surface Transforms, Future Industrial Services and Ames Goldsmith.

Seybourne said that it plans to undertake selective development to release 15 acres of the site for industrial or warehousing on a buildto-suit basis with units from 50 to 250,000 sq ft.

- Housebuilder **Bellway** has purchased a 10 acre site in Whiston with planning permission to build 133 new homes. Construction work on the new development is expected to start imminently.
- Housebuilder **Stewart Milne Homes** will transform part of the former British Insulated Callenders Cables site to create 68 new homes (a mix of two, three, four and five bedroom properties). The scheme will be known as Callenders Green.
- At Prescot Park, Barratt Homes, Anwyl Homes, Taylor Wimpey and Countryside are building nearly 600 new properties providing a great choice of high quality homes. Anwyl Homes and Taylor Wimpey are developing three and four

bedroom homes while Barratt Homes will be developing two, three and four bedroom properties. The Countryside development will include a mix of one and two bedroom apartments and three and four bedroom houses, available for private rent.

- Bellway Homes has acquired over 8 acres of land in Roby for a new residential development, known as Nutwood. The development will comprise of 87 properties, a range of high quality three and four bedroom homes. Construction is soon to start, with a sales launch expected in the summer.
- Planning applications are expected imminently for development at Knowsley's prestigious Halsnead Garden Village.

Liverpool City Region in top four for growth

A new report has identified Liverpool City Region as one of the UK's top four growth hot spots.

The study analysed growth prospects in the UK's leading urban economies and measured their growth potential against six key pillars; workforce and skills, infrastructure, business environment, place, city brand and housing.

The report ranks Liverpool City Region 4th nationally, just behind Edinburgh, Oxford and Cambridge but ahead of London, Birmingham and Manchester.

Gaynor said, "Francesco and I are overjoyed to be given this opportunity. We already have a long-standing relationship with Prescot which we consider to be our home. Our vision is to create a community café, a meeting place for friends, a centre for activity, entertainment and conversation in the heart of Prescot. We plan to host a range of events that will animate and bring Market Place to life all year round."

Work is about to begin with the new café due to open in September 2018. The redesign is by Mark Wray Architects, who were chosen last year from a list of 45 architects from around the world.

KNOWSLEY LANDMARK MAKES HISTORIC ENGLAND'S LIST OF HIDDEN GEMS



Suite success

After a successful 2017, this year has started off with a flurry of activity at the Suites Hotel with work commencing on the refurbishment of 78 suites. Working with local suppliers the hotel is investing £500,000 to upgrade its offering to local, national and international guests. Most of the work is now complete and already the hotel is reporting improved occupancy levels.





Plans submitted for Earlsfield development

Plans for a new mixed-use development – Earlsfield Park – have now been submitted for approval by developer Ion and its partner Knowsley Estate.

The site is located close to junction 2 of the M57 and it is intended to provide 40 acres of employment space along with 160 homes.

The project includes a pub/restaurant with three-storey hotel alongside, a petrol station with convenience store, and pedestrian and cycle routes. It is lon's intention to create a broad mix of business space, with advanced manufacturing R&D facilities along with sub-regional logistics space and office and workshops.

The current application is seeking detailed consent for the housing, and two speculative industrial units of 45,000 sq ft each, along with the petrol station and store and pub/hotel development.

The planning application will be considered by the Council later this year.
